Conflict Region Minerals Policy

On August 22, 2012, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") issued the final conflict minerals rule under Section 1502 the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the "Conflict Minerals Rule").

The Conflict Minerals Rule require manufacturers who file certain reports with the SEC to disclose whether the products they manufacture or contract to manufacture contain "conflict minerals" originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries ("Covered Countries").

The definition of "conflict minerals" refers to gold, as well as tin, tantalum, and tungsten, the derivatives of cassiterite, columbite-tantalite, and wolframite, regardless of where they are sourced, processed or sold.

Covered countries include Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, the Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda; and Zambia.

Precision Die and Stamping support the aims and objectives of the U.S. legislation of ending violent conflict in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and the surrounding countries and is committed to complying with any requirements applicable to our Company under the Conflict Minerals Rule.
