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Precision Die and Stamping Compliance Policies

Precision Die and Stamping requires that all suppliers comply with the following requirements and flow them down to all sub-suppliers.

REACH, ROHS, and California Prop. 65:

All materials must be compliant to the current versions or REACH, ROHS, and California Prop. 65. Any substance not compliant with these standards must be declared to Precision Die and Stamping, listing the substance and percent concentration.

Conflict Region Minerals Policy:

On August 22, 2012, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) issued the final conflict minerals rule under Section 1502 the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the “Conflict Minerals Rule”).

The Conflict Minerals Rule require manufacturers who file certain reports with the SEC to disclose whether the products they manufacture or contract to manufacture contain “conflict minerals” originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries (“Covered Countries”).

The definition of “conflict minerals” refers to gold, as well as tin, tantalum, and tungsten, the derivatives of cassiterite, columbite-tantalite, and wolframite, regardless of where they are sourced, processed or sold.

Covered countries include Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, the Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda; and Zambia.
